NEW LIFE SAVING DEFIBRILLATOR NOW IN THE VILLAGE

Wednesday 30th September, 2015

For the added safety of our residents, an emergency defibrillator (AED) has now been installed on the wall outside The Co-Operative on Station road, in the village, generously donated by Wimborne & Ferndown Lions Club.

The Parish Council believe the defibrillator will also potentially benefit the many visitors who cycle or walk through the area. Of course, we hope we never need to use any of this equipment in an emergency, but it is reassuring for the community that the equipment is available if required.

An expert training session, by Community Heartbeat, will be held in West Moors Memorial Hall on Wednesday 4th November, 2015 between 10.30 am and approximately 12.30 noon.

This session will be open to the Public who can either be trained in the use of the Defibrillator or simply watch how it is done. Anyone who completes the training will be provided with a certificate by post.

This awareness will hopefully give people the knowledge and confidence to act decisively if someone suffers a Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA).
